Chief of Police – Tim Sommer – See attached report – highlights below.

- A. Taser recertification was done for all officers.
- B. ELVES program served 22 families (68 children)
- C. Will enroll in IDOT Traffic Controls this next year. Drunk driving, distracted driving, and speeding are the focuses for this coming year. IDOT will reimburse overtime pay for these activities.
- D. There was an increase in calls from 2022 to 2023 of about 150. Trustee Hendrickson asked if there were any trends to these increases. Chief answered with nothing particularly noticeable.
- E. Trustee Hendrickson asked if the license plate reader was up and running. Chief answered with yes, the rechargeable battery lasts about 2 weeks. It has been moved around the Village, except for Route 29, because that would require an MOU with IL State Police being a state route.
- F. FLOCK (body cameras) is wanting the Village to upgrade a bit. Chief will be able to provide details by budget time.
