PUBLIC FORUM

Zac Geist – Informing the Board that the activity, high school kick-off event for the street closure later on the agenda. The Rochester Football game starts at 1 pm in Chicago. The Filling Station will be hosting the event with the game on several TVs.

Samples were submitted on time, but the lab was behind and as a result violations were handed out to everyone in that situation.

- A. Det. Harris has already started his new position.
- B. Body cameras are all live and used regularly.
- C. The application deadline was originally June 2nd, with about 10 applicants. That deadline has been extended to see if a larger pool of candidates can be collected.
- D. Trustee Hendrickson stated with extended 4th of July, there has been a great deal of fireworks every night. In the future, can more regulations be shared out to the general public about time restrictions, etc.? Chief stated that there were only 3 calls that came in. There was a Facebook post from RPD about what was allowed or not within the Village. Officers did respond to calls and issued citations as needed. Rochester PD took a stricter approach this year in comparison to other surrounding Villages.

Public Works Superintendent – James Foster

See attached report – highlights below.

- A. Water main job on Mill Street is going very well. They did some testing on watermain from Pleasant to Park and it came back clear. The contractors are working ahead of schedule. They started new meter pits and mains today on several residences. Residences along this path do not all have expansion tanks. This may be needed for several houses which will incur costs for those homeowners.
- B. Up and running is a Mag Meter for the lift station. This meter will tell the Village how many gallons we are sending from the very end of the Village to each residence.
- C. N. Oak Hill Road seems to be done with mill and overlay. They found a storm drain that was not known and have since done restructuring around that drain. Where Penacook meets Oak Hill Road, there is clay under the surface. They suggested putting in some sort of drainage to wick the water away, which Supt. Foster will add to his "To Do" list.
- D. CDL training The second student is done. The third student starts tomorrow and then there are 3 more employees to go through that training.
